CURRICULAR & CO-CURRICULAR ACTIVITIES

The development of learner's cognitive, affective and psychomotor domain is supported by the school through curricular and co-curricular activities throughout the academic session. Regular parent - teacher meetings & parent - principal interactions helped us to ensure maximum participation of parents to improve the scholastic and co-scholastic areas in school-related activities. School has taken some extra efforts to improve the quality of students' performance. The efforts are:

- Enrichment Classes- Enrichment Classes in Maths, science & Social Science are regularly organized for students of Classes X.
- Remedial Programmes- Remedial Programmes are organized in all subjects for students of I-X during zero periods.
- **Sports Coaching-** Coaching classes have been held for major games throughout the year in Basket Ball, Volleyball and Athletics.
- **Regular Assessment** Monthly tests for classes I to X have really helped the students work upon their inherent skills and revise the topics that are taught week-wise.

Since its inception, it has been School's vision to give an opportunity to every student to polish all their inherent skills that we have been achieving by conducting co-curricular activities like inter-house and inter-school competitions throughout the year.

OLYMPIADS

An assessment tool that centered on a curriculum-based rating scale was administered in the school.

This tool allowed teachers to determine students' level of mastery of previous and current years' curricula, which helped them, determine the extent to which alternative instructional strategies and remedial content were necessary for both individuals and groups. This approach resulted in significantly improved outcomes. School has been conducting these Science Olympiad Foundation NSO, NCO, IMO & IEO wherein the students have been showing astounding performances. 1 student in IEO, 2 students in NSO and 5 students in IMO have qualified for the second level exam. Few students have been able to grab amazingly wonderful international ranks. NCO result is yet awaited.

CBSE RECOMMENDATIONS

Functioning with the sole objective of meeting the demands of a competitive world, CBSE implements necessary changes from time to time. The most significant recommendation made by the board with effect from the Academic year 2018-19 is the revised assessment pattern for classes VI-X.

The CBSE will conduct Class X examination for 80 marks in each of the subjects covering 100% of the syllabus.20% of the weightage in each of the subjects will be assessed based on continuous assessment during the academic year in the form of multiple assessments, portfolio assessments, notebooks maintenance and periodic tests.

FUNCTIONS & CELEBRATIONS:

International Yoga Day: As part of worldwide International Yoga Day, 2019, Bal Bharati Public School, MB Anuppur has also observed this day on June 21, 2019 in association with Hindustan Power in the Township Lawn with the theme "Yoga for Harmony and Peace". A Yoga session of sixty minutes from 7.00 am to 8.00 am was organized in which the Hindustan Power officials, township residents and students took part enthusiastically and practised various 'asanas' of Yoga and pranayama. WORKSHOPS FOR STUDENTS:

<u>Fire Safety Workshop</u>: Keeping up with the tradition this year again BBPS organized a 'Workshop on Fire Safety'.

The HPPPL fire fighting team arrived at the school campus in the afternoon; the team explained the students about the type of fire, how fire triangle is formed and how to extinguish fire. The students were informed that there are four types of fire which can be controlled by appropriate type of extinguishers. We also learnt some domestic as well as actual ways to put the fire off. We were taken to the ground to show us the fire safety demonstration. Students and teachers also took part in this fire extinguishing drill.

TOURS & EXCURSIONS:

The Annual Adventure Trip to Solan: Outdoor adventures and educational trips are an integral part of Bal Bharati Public School's life. These trips not only inculcate mental strength and moral values amongst the children but also help them in developing social skills and comradeship. Keeping up with the tradition, this year again BBPS organised an adventure trip to break away from the routine.

The BBPS family that included 36 students and 4 staff members moved for an adventure tour to Solan, Himachal Pradesh from 8/03/17 to 11/03/17. The trip was extremely exciting and adventurous where the students enjoyed and participated in all the activities with a great zeal.

Exploring the Rural India – A trip to Jhaaitaal Village: A field trip on 16TH February was organized by the school administration to the nearby villages with the collaboration of CSR Department, Hindustan Power, Anuppur. Students of classes VI and VII were privileged to go for the trip to experience real life learning regarding agricultural activities in nearby villages. Students learned about the cultivation of forest product Lac and the cultivation of mushroom. They also got to know about the steps involved in the production of chick pea and pulses like Masoor and moong. They saw the weedier and were also explained about its how it works. They also saw the irrigation system provided by the CSR to the agricultural fields. They interacted with a Self Help Group in the village and came to know that it's a 12 member group called the Puja Group. Students were informed about how such SHGs are formed and how they function. Such SHGs are helpful especially for the poor women of the village.

GAMES & SPORTS:

Physical fitness has its own merit in student's daily life. It lays importance on healthy lifestyle and helpsin developing social skills. Sports play a pivotal role in instilling among our impressionable learners values that would hold them in good stead throughout their lives, such as, discipline, perseverance, team spirit, sportsmanship etc.

At School each learner is expected to play at least two games and also achieve the Minimum Physical Fitness Programme that has been formulated for the learners. School maintains a comprehensive record of Medical and Fitness status of each student and teacher. Those whose fitness is hindered by medical reasons were

regularly monitored and communicated to the parents. It is hoped that these effortswould motivate our students to maintain healthy life style throughout.

We have marked some achievements this year which are:

- o U-14 & U-17 Basketball girl's team won at Division Level Basketball tournament. It gets me immense pleasure to announce that Out of 10 girls, 7 were selected for State Level Tournament held at Gwalior (M.P.)
